

Let me tell you the story of a little gill named Abby. Although she has not lived a long life yet, she has already experienced life in ways not all adults have. She has endured severe challenges and unforgiving trauma. Yet, when you see her, she radiates happiness and life!

Born in January 2016, Abby was a happy and healthy baby. Around the age of two, we became concerned about her delayed development and started extensive research, which lead to an Autism Spectrum Disorder diagnosis in August of 2018. In 2020 she received an epilepsy diagnosis and started epilepsy treatment. As her parents, we always had a gut instinct that there

was something we were missing.

We continued our search for answers and finally in 2021 she was diagnosed with Rett Syndrome. She was 5 years old.

Rett syndrome is a rare genetic neuro-developmental disorder that impacts almost all areas of a childs life. It is mostly seen in girls and is also described as a spectrum disorder, meaning symptoms and traits will manifest to different degrees in different children.

Since her initial autism diagnosis in 2018, Abby has been received countless hours of therapy, including ABA, Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Equine Therapy, Music Therapy,

Hydrotherapy and Physio therapy. Abby bravely faces considerable challenges on a daily basis. She is non-speaking and currently trying to learn how to use a speech device to communicate. The fact that her hand function is also compromised as a result of her syndrome does make it difficult for her to operate the hand held tablet. She has also shown significant regression in her ability to walk and balance confidently, but works hard on maintaining her body's strength.

She has epileptic seizures on a daily basis, which are managed to a

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When South Africa held its first democratic election, with Nelson Mandela elected as its first democratic President, 21 March, Human Rights Day was officially proclaimed a public holiday.









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
Crime pattern analysis for the greater Olifantsfontein area for the period 2024-02-01 TO 2024-02-29

Robbery with a firearm








Time (grouped 3 hours)








major contributors towards the pollution in the Hennopsriver system. The OBF contributed R30 000.00 towards the project.
